

## Year 7 Catch Up Funding Impact and Evaluation Report Academic Year 2017 - 18

### Context of Academy

The rates of progress in English and mathematics for the large majority of students are at least good and often outstanding. All groups of students achieve well including those who have special educational needs and students in receipt of pupil premium funding. The sixth form is outstanding. Excellent teaching is driving up standards and rapidly accelerating progress. Achievement is good and improving strongly.

The quality of teaching is outstanding because teachers have exceptional skills and teachers have high expectations of their students. Teachers are expert in their subject areas and inspire their students to be enthusiastic, motivated learners.

Students who have special educational needs have every opportunity to succeed and to reach their potential as part of a very inclusive and caring school experience. Information about their performance is used very well by all staff and teachers support all learners with well-focused planning and make the very best use of any additional resource that is available. This has promoted outstanding progress. This group of students achieve particularly well in the sixth form.

The Academy was awarded Outstanding in all aspects in the most recent Ofsted inspection

### Objectives of Year 7 Catch Up Funding

- To close the gap by providing intensive literacy and numeracy support and raise the attainment of those students entitled to Catch up Premium
- To raise self-esteem and aspirations of students entitled to Catch up Premium
- To enhance existing provision.
- To identify concerns and target intervention and support to accelerate progress
- To intervene quickly if any chosen strategy or intervention fails to show impact
- To ensure that parents are informed and involved where appropriate.

### Summary of Year 7 Catch Up Funding Spend

- *Small Group Classes* – Intensive low student to teacher ratio class sizes
- *Additional Specialist Literacy and Numeracy provision* - through the support department
- *Additional Adult Support* - for those most in need in English and Maths classes
- *Homework Clubs* – a choice of two, staffed homework clubs and an additional Maths homework club for those not on target to make expected progress
- *Pastoral Support* – via the Academy's pastoral system and through the Pastoral Leader
- *Additional Humanities Group* – access to humanities lessons delivered through specialists focusing specifically on literacy.
- *1 – 1 Reading and numeracy Intervention*
- *Parental Involvement* – An invitation to parents to explore how they can best support their children
- *Increased Capacity in English and Mathematics* – Additions have been made to the numeracy and literacy teams to provide five lessons per week of each core subject
- *E-Learning* – Four out of Five English lessons per week take place in the design suite for many of our learners.
- *Literacy Resources* – Comprehension, reading and writing materials such as *Heroes*, *ActivTeach*, *Barrington-Stokes series* and *SMART Skills Booster packs*.
- Teacher planning aids – such as The Collins Reading and Writing Planning Aids
- *Additional Functional Maths* – Extra-curricular lessons to study numeracy in practical situations
- *Emotional literacy lessons for vulnerable students whose attainment might be affected by mental health and well-being issues.*
- *Outreach support to feeder primaries.*

**An additional weekly lesson of emotional literacy will be continued in 2017/2018 for those students whose attainment might be affected by mental health and well-being issues.**

**Expert teachers in below level 4 literacy will liaise and support out local feeder primaries to raise standards and to support early intervention strategies during 2017/2018.**
