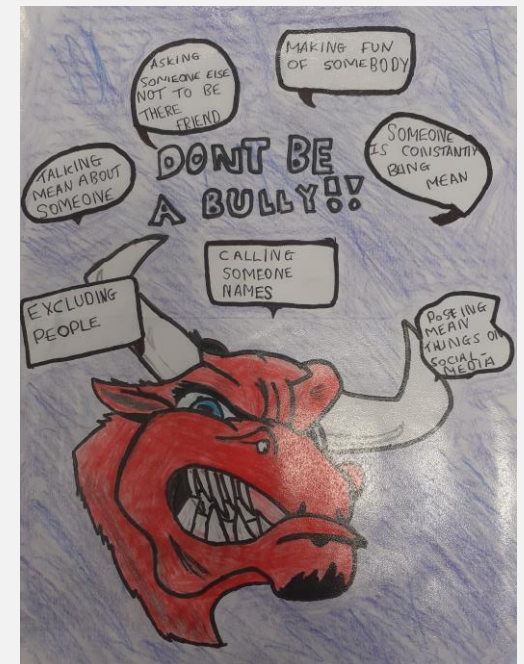

Lead out Loud sessions have been delivered to all students.

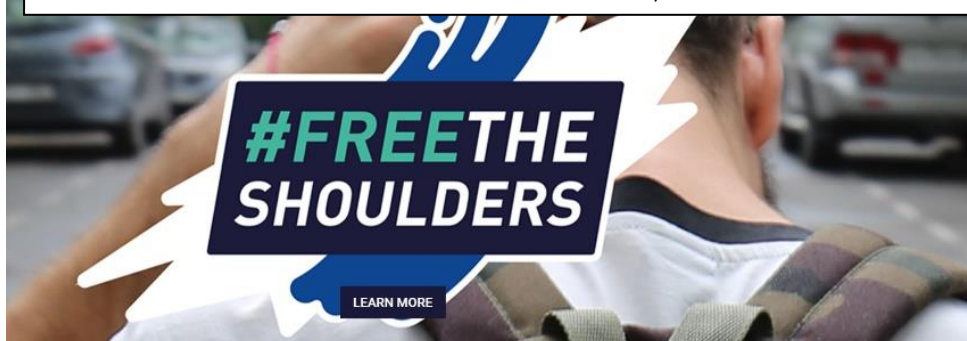
We have had four sessions covering:

Unwanted and Aggressive Behaviour

Adults and children have the right to come into school or work without being subjected to unwanted and aggressive behaviour. This can be things that can seem small such as snatching someone's tie or messing up their hair. All the way to physically hurting someone by pushing, kicking or punching them. This isn't limited to physical violence either. Aggressive language can be equally harmful. Threatening someone or using hurtful language can be just as bad. Anything Unwanted by someone is aggressive!

Respect: due regard for the feelings, wishes or rights of others.

We treat others how we would like to be treated ourselves.



We listen to and acknowledge the views of others.



We consider the feelings of others before we speak.

So, what can we do to stop bullying?

1. Tell a teacher or trusted adult in school.
2. Be kind and show solidarity with the bullied person. Sometimes bullies pick on people just
